| Spartacus is a 13.5 year old male Boxer. This is not my first time using<br>Cansema. I used two<br>very small 22g veterinary version on Spartacus' lump. I have taken<br>care of over a dozen boxers since the 1980s and I know their main<br>cause of death has been cancer and heart problems.<br>I have also used this stuff on myself four times. Three of the four, I had<br>reactions and small tiny lump came off my cheek on one of the times<br>The lump on Spartacus was difficult to put a bandage on. I could not<br>actually. It's good to have H30 water or Vetricyn extra strength just to<br>spray on the healing wound so it doesn't get infected. | I had to shave the fur with a Bic razor in order for the Cansema to penetrate. I had a<br>very small nick from the disposable razor that allowed a small dab of Cansema to<br>penetrate. It eventually caused a sinkhole on the lump and I kept eye on Spartacus'<br>reaction/how he was doing depending on how much and how often I used, but at first<br>it was a small dab daily. He did lick it off a few times.<br>The lump incidentally was small for a long time and then all of a sudden had grown to<br>a hard lemon or lime sized lump which caused me concern.
